Dear Brother:--

I do not know that you are the party to write to, but if you are not, you will pass it on to the proper individual. I inclose some correspondence that has come in regard to the translation of the book "Christ Our Saviour" in French. Now, there are some points in this which need special attention.

First, I see they have translated from the old edition of the book "Christ Our Saviour" that had a department in regard to the childhood and youth in the first part of the book by itself. Now, they should not use this edition, for mother has prepared an entirely new manuscript for the book, and this is the same that is now being issued by the Review & Herald office. So if the French people are to translate and reprint the book, they should translate from the new edition and not take the old edition, as they evidently have done.

Second. This book in the foreign languages used to belong to the Gen. Conf., but recently it was voted to return it to mother. So the ownership of this book in the foreign languages belongs to mother, and all questions of this kind should be referred to her.

I thought it was best to communicate at once with you people in regard to this, and then you can take such steps as you see fit.

Our meetings still hold up their interest. The hall is crowded every Sunday night and very many who attend are regular with every meeting and are becoming deeply interested.
