Dear Brother

I hold in my hand your letter of August 22. In it you tell me that some of our brethren feel conscientious over the matter of insuring our meeting houses.

In times past, we have heard from many who felt the same way. Several times I have been present when this matter was discussed in the presence of Sister White, and each time she has advised us that it <sup>is</sup> well for us to insure meeting houses and our institutions.

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On one occasion she remarked that if it should become known that we did not insure our meeting houses and our institutions, that the enemies of our faith would take great delight in burning them. On another occasion she said, "Certainly, if there is a debt on a church, the only honest thing we can do is to insure it, thus providing for the protection from loss of those who have lent us money."

We do not have any written statement from the pen of Sister White regarding this matter, but there are a number of people who have heard the things that I have just written, and who would testify if it is necessary to secure testimony to corroborate what I have written.
