Dear Sister

The afternoon mail has brought to me your letter of August 22, and I am improving this first opportunity to write to you in response.

I am fully persuaded that the statement in "Ministry of Healing", page 358, is correct, that "in most cases there should not be a great disparity in age."

You ask where does the exception come in. I think it comes in clearly and fully in a case like yours, where persons have been acquainted for a long time, where there is unity, of purpose, oneness in aims and plans, where there is desire for service in the Master's cause. In such cases which are unusual, I think that the exception come in very clearly.

It would be presumption on my part to give advice, but I can clearly express the opinion that if the conditions are as described in your letter, that I should not be able to offer any serious objection to your marriage.

I might multiply words, but I think it is unnecessary and unfitting that I should do so. I believe that your mother was right when she said, "If you love him, take him."
