JAMES WHITE'S REMARKS ON THE KING OF THE NORTH

[Excerpt from a talk at a large camp meeting in Battle Creek, Mich., after a sermon by Elder Uriah Smith on Daniel 11. A longhand report which will be vouched for by those who listened.]

"Elder Smith has given a very fine talk on the eleventh chapter of Daniel, and his interpretation seems plausible, but IF the legs of iron, and feet of iron and clay in the second chapter represent Rome, and IF the nondescript, ten-horned beast, and the little horn of the seventh chapter represent Rome, and IF the little horn which waxed exceeding great of the 8th chapter represents Rome, the King of the North represents Rome also.
