

Letter from Rebecca White to W.C. White
Feb. 22, 1927, Otsego, Michigan

Dear Brother Will and Family:

. . . Edson says, Will is very dear to me; and he has been relieved to learn that you are out of danger. (W.C.W. had had hernia surgery). Edson is better than for some weeks and can eat usually well. He walks to town every few days. . . . He seems cheerful. He is reading the many letters which he has received from your lmother and he dreams of her, Elder Andrews, Smith, and those he loved and admired. The nights are more troublesome than the days but winter is passing with us. . . .

Edson is trying to assemble slides for Elder Munson, and he has some work on the order in Mr. Prieger's care now. He will not allow me to assist in getting the orders off. Then he forgets what he has done and starts all over again, traveling in a circle. . . .
